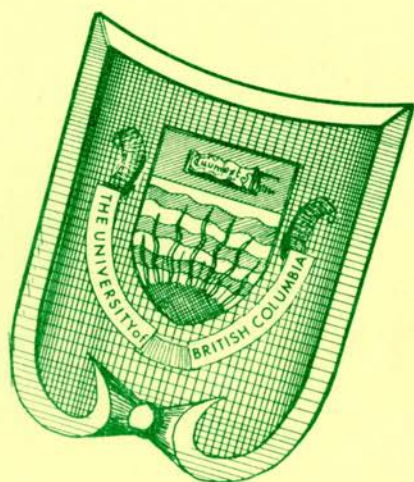

Throughout history, forests and their trees have been benefactors of mankind, a fact always appreciated by foresters. Trees have also been considered as symbols of individual and family lives. This cross-section shows an 88-year-old lodgepole pine with six major scars dating between 1918 and 1942.

The Sopron School of Forest Engineering has its own major scars through its colorful history. The 1919 scar coincides with our first great trek from Selmechanya to Sopron, because of the disastrous Treaty of Trianon at the end of World War I. The 1945 scar marks the end of World War II, or the beginning of the communist regime in Hungary. The 1956 scar symbolizes the Sopron group's most recent *en masse* trek to Canada. Since then, almost 30 years have gone by.

Foresters know that with the passage of time new growth will cover and heal old wounds of a living tree. Our first-hand experience tell us that human wounds, created by such major upheavals as the loss of one's homeland, are healing with time as well, especially if the healing process can take place under freedom.
